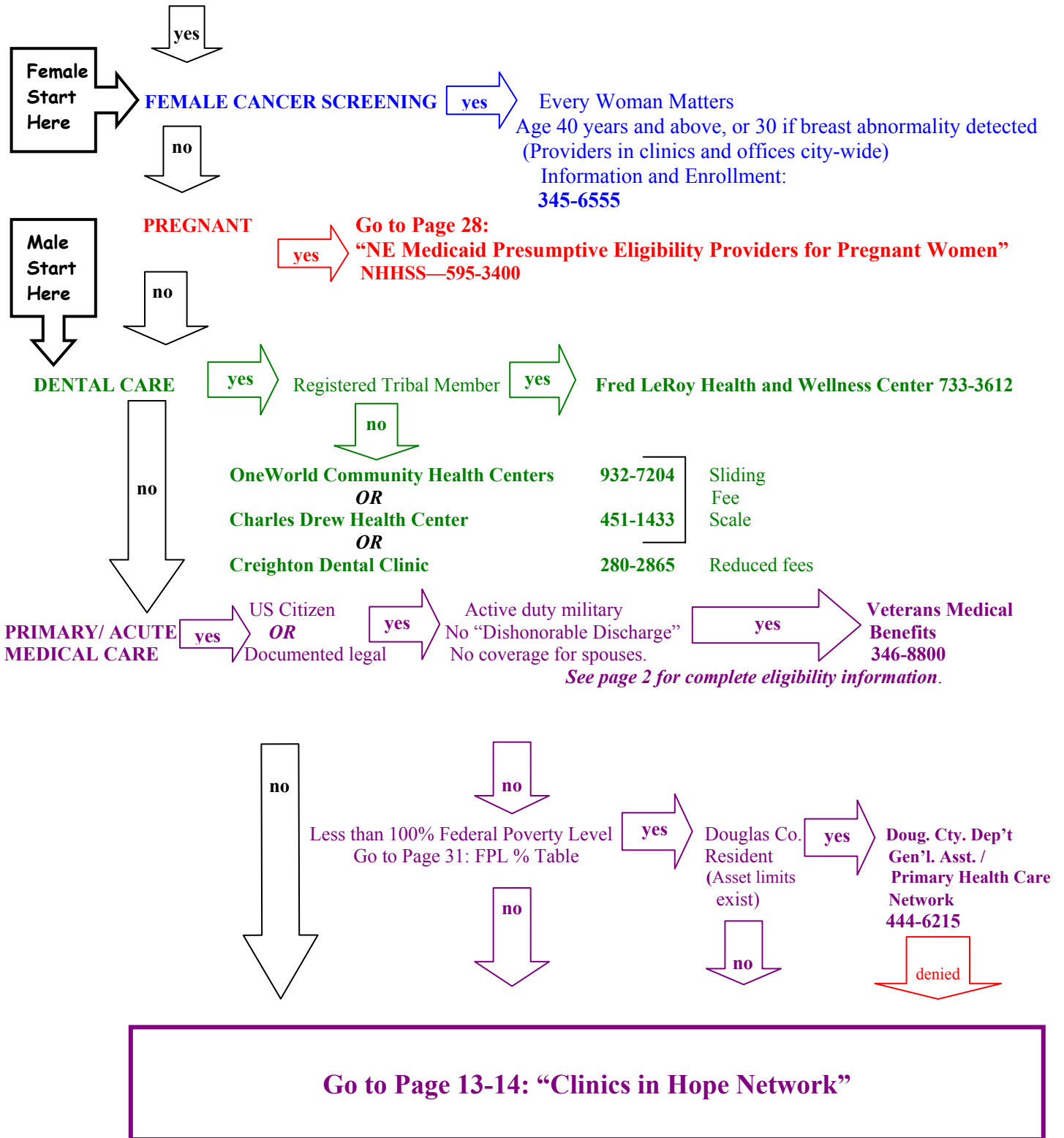


**Chart # 1A: Primary Healthcare Resources

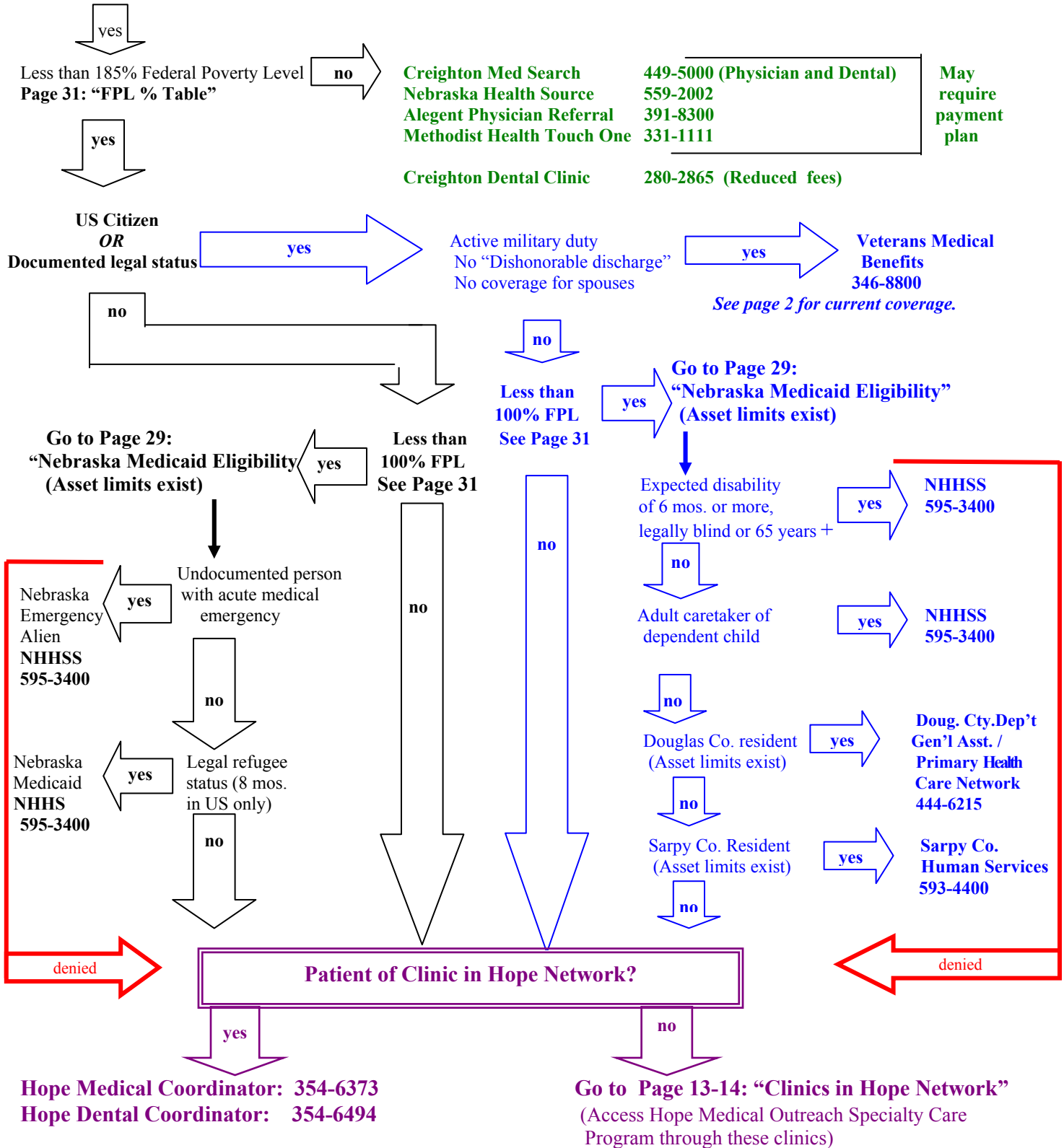

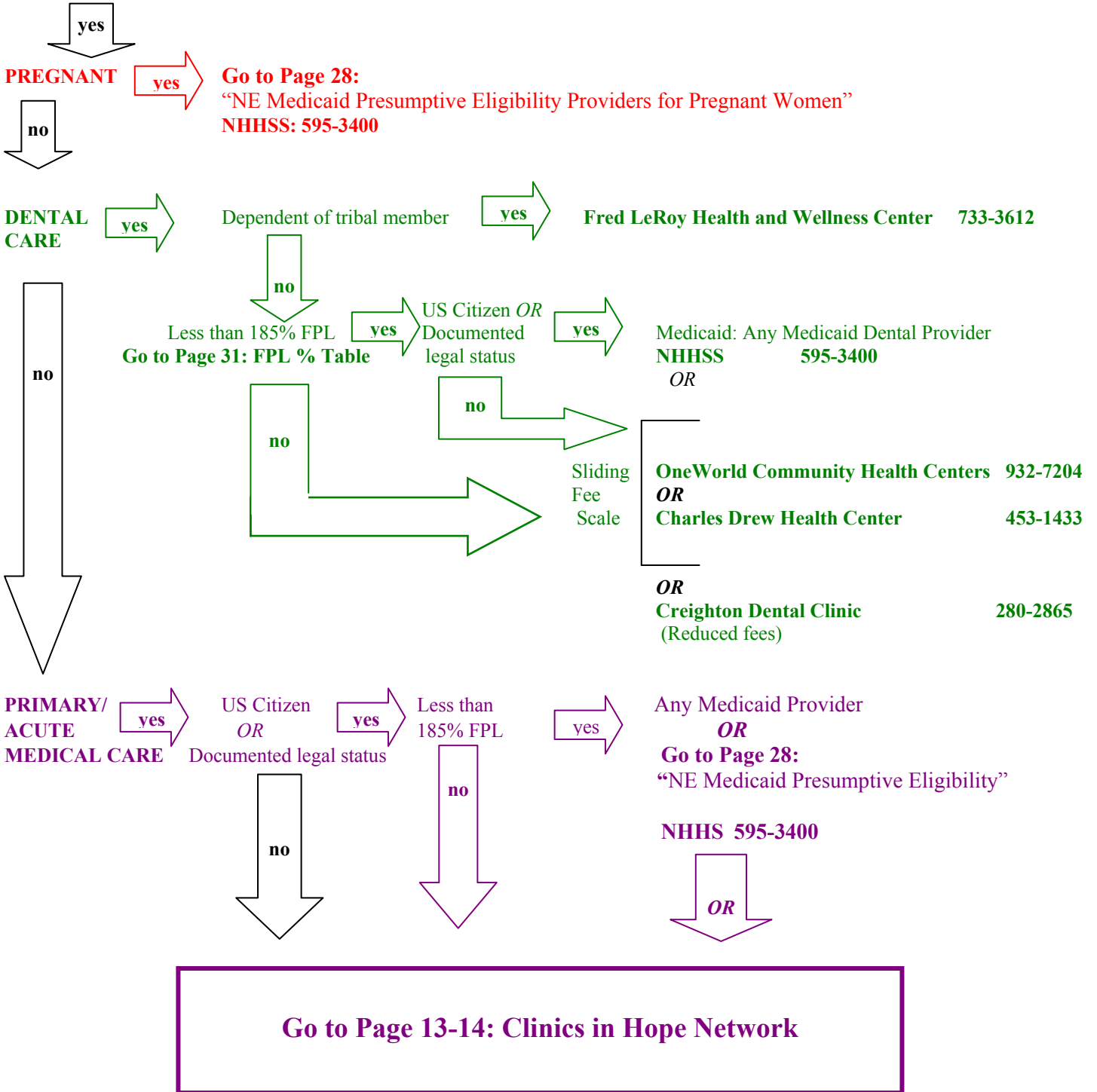
Chart #1C: Specialty Care Referral Screening Tool UNINSURED Adult Nebraska Resident (19 years and above)

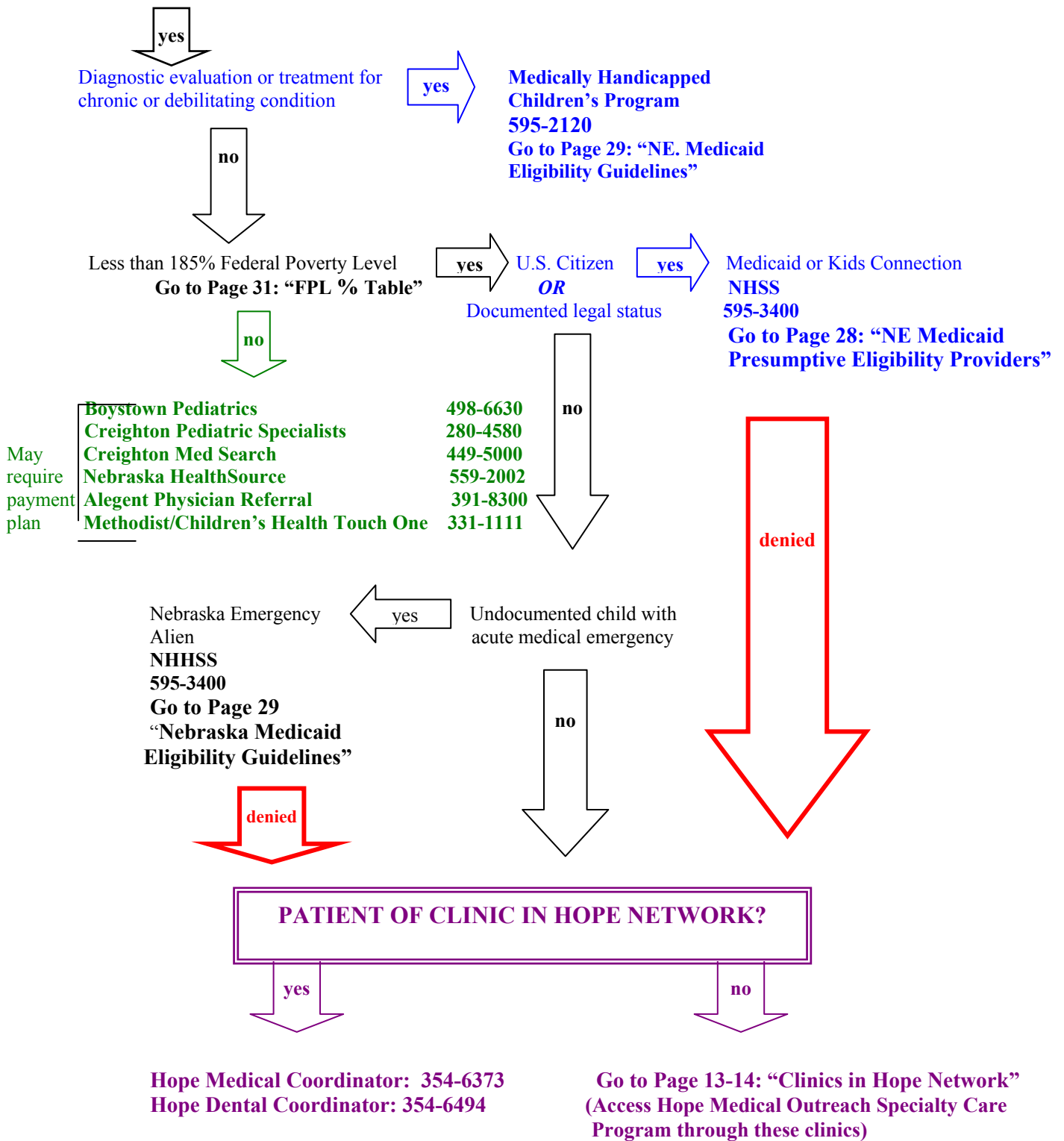

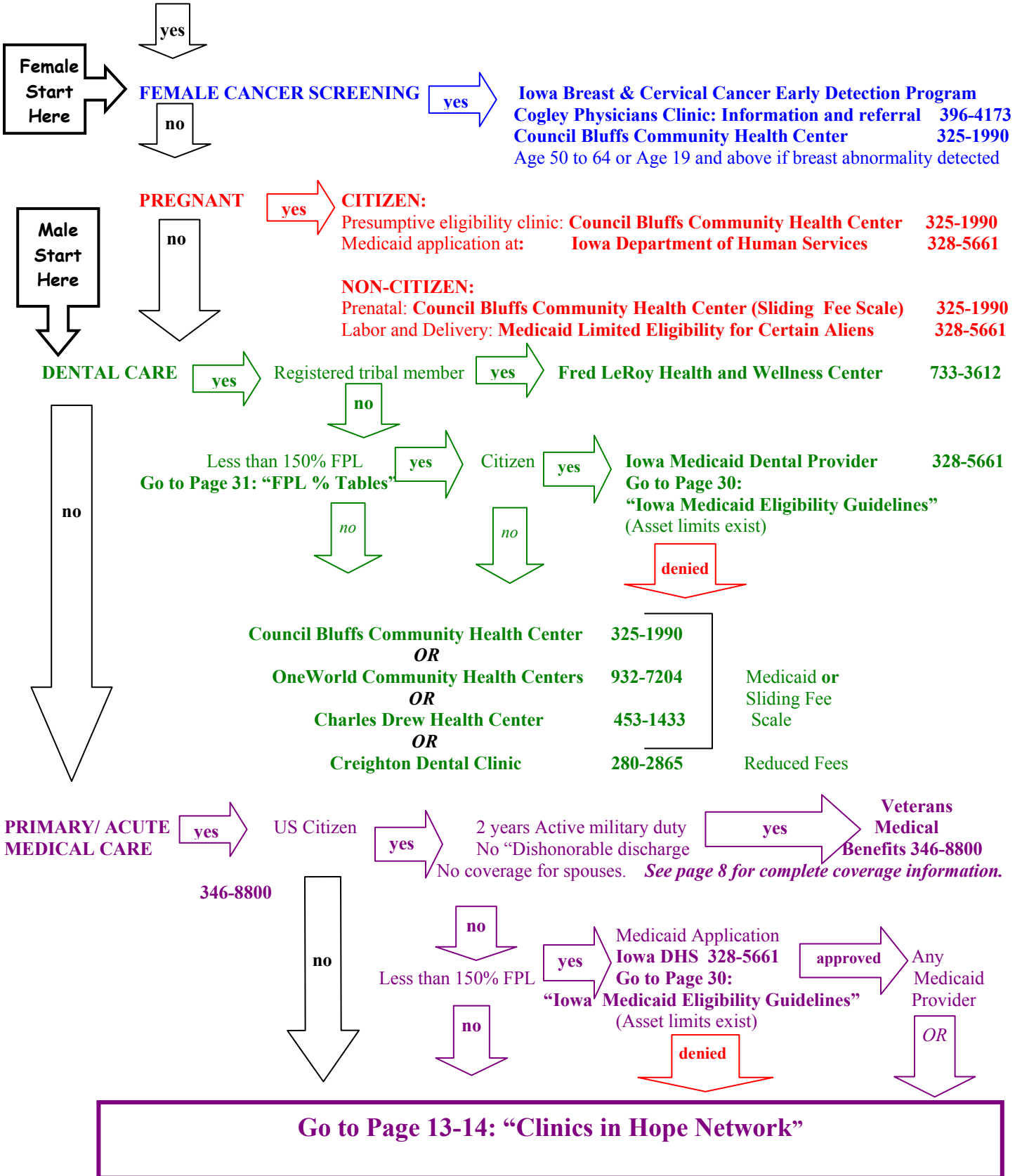
Chart #2C: Specialty Care Screening Tool

UNINSURED Adult Iowa Resident (19 years and older)**

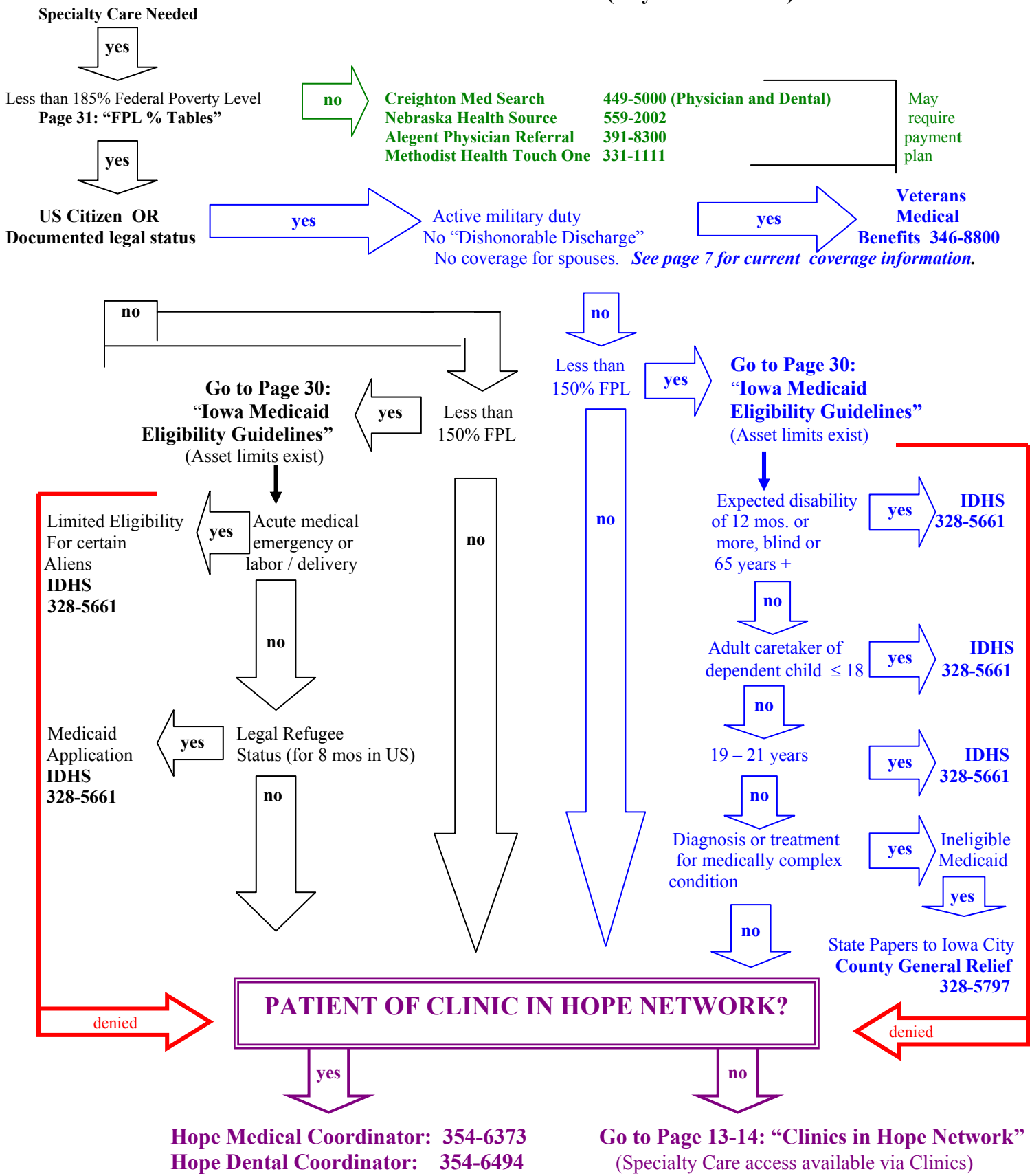

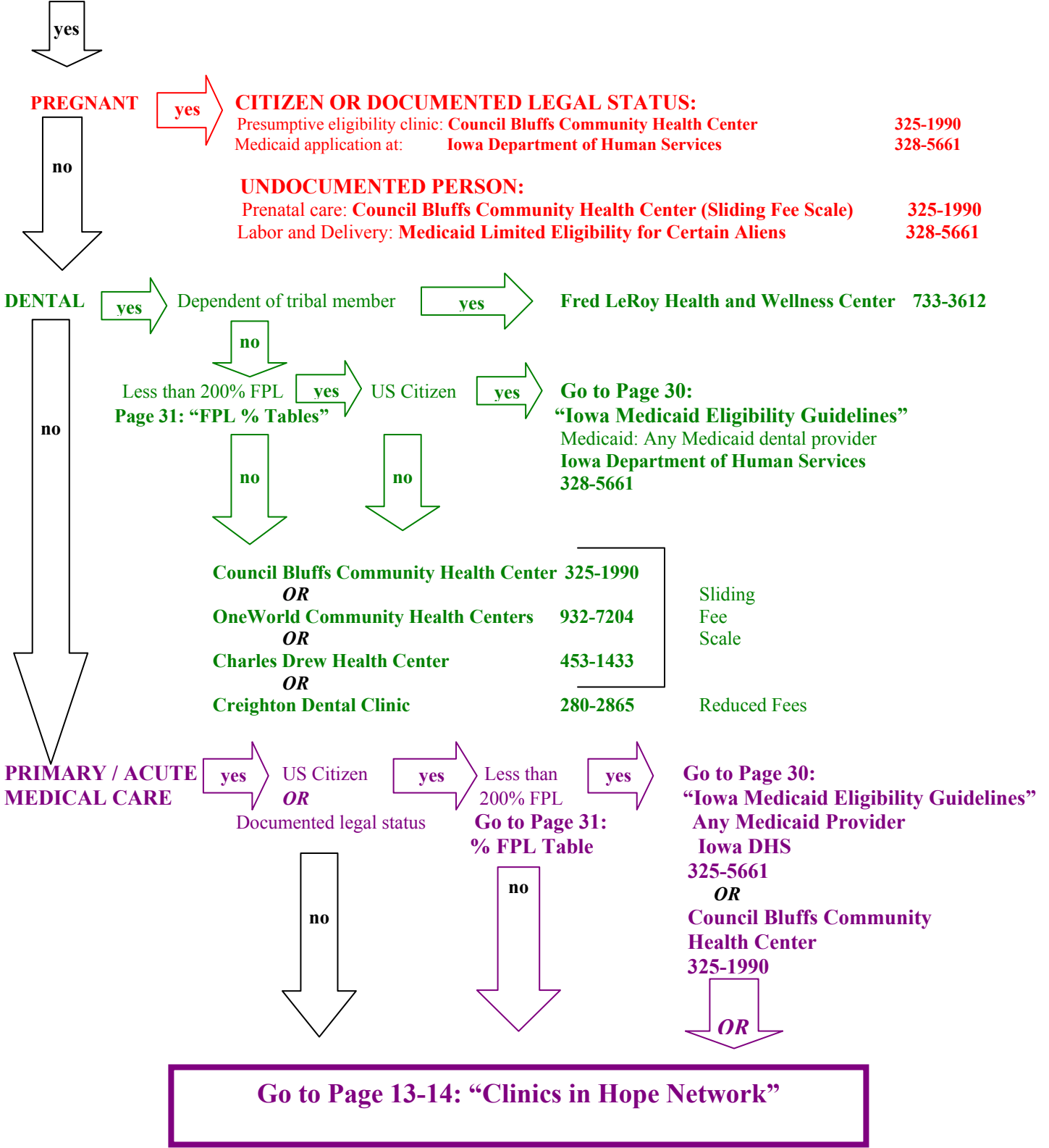

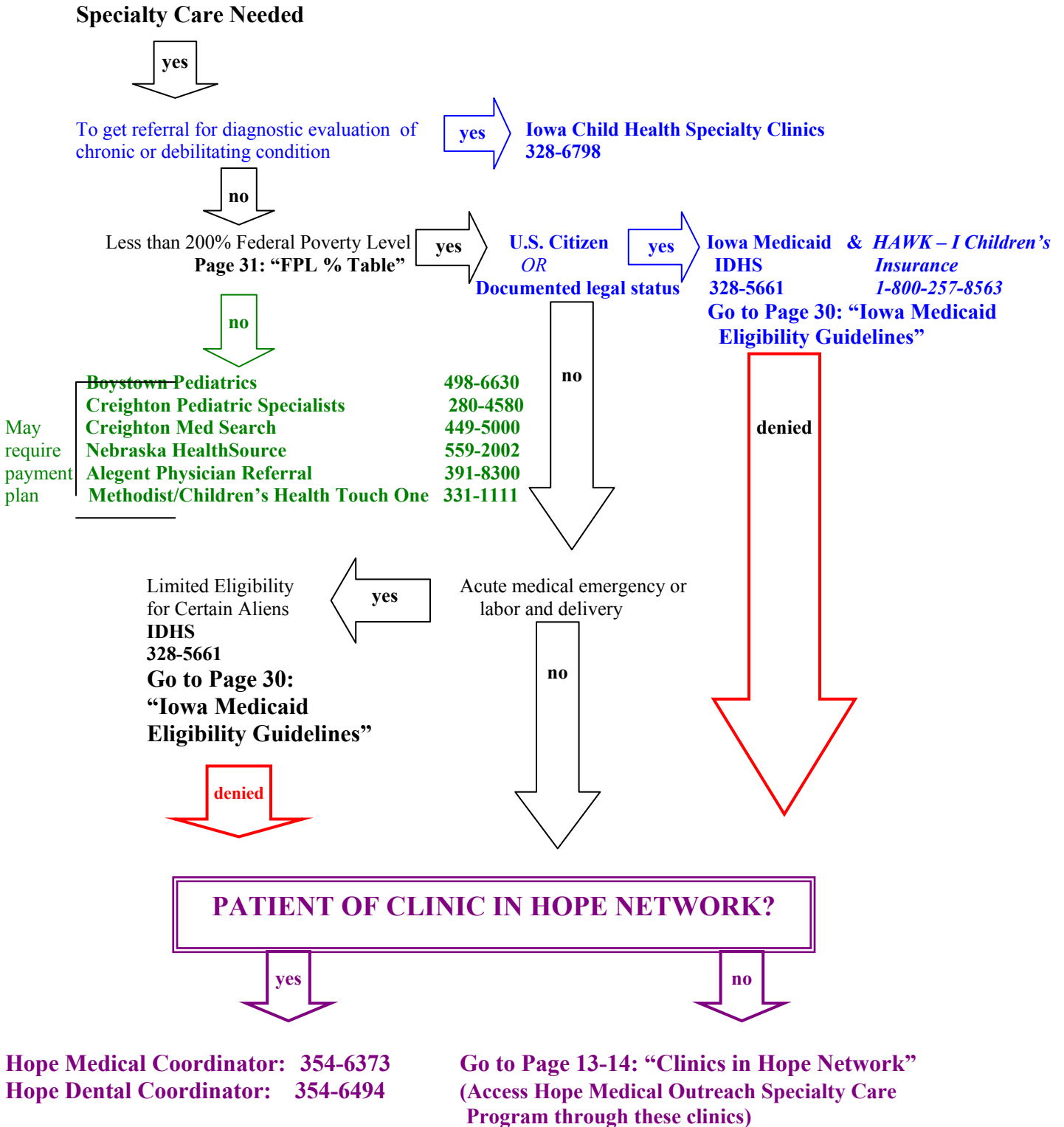
